Covid Update

Over the last 7 days there have been 404 new positive cases in Highland (to 30 September), a decrease from last week when 615 were reported. This means the latest 7-day rate per 100,000 has decreased from 261.2 per 100,000 last week to 171.6 per 100,000 as of 30 September. Whilst it is positive to see the that the numbers continue to decrease, is remains important to be careful and stick to the Scottish Government guidelines.

In terms of neighbourhood data, the map below and accompanying table, highlights the positive cases per 100,000 in communities across the Highland area. The test positivity rate on was 4.7% on 28 September, down from 6.1% on 21 September.

Scotland has Moved Beyond Level Zero

From 9 August 2021 the whole of Scotland moved to beyond Level 0. You can find Scottish Government guidance for everyone on how to stay safe and prevent the spread of COVID-19 here.

Scottish Government messages this week

- Children aged 12-15 are now receiving letters inviting them to get one dose of the Covid vaccine. This age group have been able to attend drop-in centres to get vaccinated over the past couple of weeks, however now everyone this age will be officially invited by letter to attend an appointment.
- The Scottish government will release £25 million of funding to help small and medium sized businesses to make indoor settings safer throughout the winter months by improving ventilation. The fund expects to start making payments in November, with eligibility criteria set out over the coming weeks.
- The Scottish government has confirmed it will align its travel advice with that
 of Westminster. UK wide advice is still to be released on the position of post
 arrival testing for people travelling to the UK from non-red listed countries,
 however this is expected in the coming days.
- Invitations for coronavirus (COVID-19) booster injections are now being issued to people aged 70 and over and those aged 16 and over who are at highest risk. These groups are being contacted either by letter or by their GP with the first appointments scheduled from the week beginning 4 October.

Symptomatic Testing (with symptoms)

If you do believe you have symptoms, please self-isolate and book a PCR test. Postal PCR kits are available through NHS Inform either online here or by calling 0800 028 2816.

In addition to the local support that is available, people can get support to self isolate by calling the Council's helpline number: 0300 303 1362. This can include access to food and supplies to self isolate and individuals may be entitled to a £500 self isolation support grant.

Asymptomatic Testing (without symptoms)

It continues to be important that people test themselves even if they don't have symptoms. Taking a rapid LFD test twice a week can help stop new variants earlier, limiting the spread of the virus.

Test kits are available at pharmacies, or to order online from www.nhsinform.scot/testing, or by calling 119.

Test kits are also available at Community testing sites. The details for where these are next week are outlined below.

Community Testing 4 October – 8 October for those without symptoms (Asymptomatic)

The community testing programme offers rapid COVID-19 tests for people without symptoms.

Next week mobile testing units will be in Inverness and Fort William.

The mobile testing unit 'Moves Like Jagger' will be at B&M car park at Telford Retail Park, Inverness, IV3 5LE:

- Monday 4 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Tuesday 5 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Wednesday 6 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Thursday 7 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Friday 8 October, 9am-3:00pm

The mobile testing unit 'Testalot' will be at the Middle Street Car Park, Fort William, PH33 6EU:

- Monday 4 October, 12 noon-4:00pm
- Tuesday 5 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Wednesday 6 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Thursday 7 October, 9am-4:00pm
- Friday 8 October, 9am-1:00pm

Just to emphasise that there are no specific outbreaks in these communities, this is to support normalising testing across the area.

No appointment is necessary, and it will be open both for asymptomatic testing and to collect LFD test kits.

Please note that these drop-in sessions for community testing are only for people without symptoms. Anyone that becomes unwell should isolate immediately and seek a PCR test. PCR tests can be booked through NHS Inform online or by calling 0800 028 2816.

Those who attend a COVID-19 Mobile Clinic will also have the opportunity to enter a free monthly draw to win an Amazon Kindle e-reader (10th generation, with 6" backlit display) after completing an exit survey. The winner will be drawn by random at the end of the month.
